DON'T FORGET TO VOTE ON TUESDAY, JULY 7TH.

Pursuant to Governor Murphy's Executive Order No. 144, there will be changes in the way Somers Point residents vote at the July 7th Primary Election.

The polls are open from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; however, there are only two polling places that will be open. One is in the First Ward at 447 Bethel Road at Fire House No. 1. The second one is in the Second Ward at 129 Jordan Road at Jordan Road School.

Within the next week all voters will receive a post card in the mail indicating where to vote.

By now, every voter should have received a postage-paid, mail-in ballot. If you have not, please call the Atlantic County Board of Elections no later than June 29th at 609-625-4011. Please note: that a voter may go in person to the Atlantic County Clerk's Office/Board of Elections Dept. located at 5901 Main Street, Mays Landing, and vote up until Monday, July 6th at 3:00 p.m.

If you mailed in your ballot and it was returned undeliverable, please re-mail it again. Unfortunately, there has been some mail sorting issues. OR, you may deposit your mail-in ballot at the nearest drop box, which has video surveillance. The closest drop box is located at the Egg Harbor Township Hall building located at 3515 Bargaintown Road.

There are two different ways to vote. You may vote by using your mail-in ballot or going to your polling place. If you go to your polling place, you will vote by paper ballot only. Voters with disabilities will be provided with an ADA compliant accommodation. Social distancing of six feet will be in effect, masks should be worn in accordance with CDC guidelines, please use hand sanitizer prior to and after voting and pens will be provided for single use and shall be kept by the voter.

Just to recap: You may vote by mailing in your ballot using a U. S. mailbox or the drop box at Egg Harbor Township Hall building, OR you may go to your designated polling place where you will vote by paper ballot only.
