**ORDINANCE No. 21 of 2014**

**AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF ATLANTIC AVENUE  
IN THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC,  
STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40:67-1(b) authorizes Municipalities to vacate public streets in the public interest; and

**WHEREAS**, it has been determined by the Somers Point City Council as follows:

1. The portion of Atlantic Avenue described below is a "paper street" marked as part of Atlantic Avenue on Sheet 4 of the Official Tax Map of Somers Point, New Jersey shows the existence of an intended public right of way.
2. It has been confirmed by the City Engineer that the City of Somers Point does not hold title to the portion of Atlantic Avenue proposed to be vacated.
3. The paper street has not been physically improved, does not provide public access, and is not needed for public road purposes.
4. The said portion of Atlantic Avenue lends itself to higher and better use than for public road purposes and that it is in the best interest of the general public and the City of Somers Point that any public easements, rights and interests in and to same shall be vacated, released and extinguished.
5. The City Engineer has confirmed that the right – of - way proposed to be vacated is fifty feet (50') in width and was initially shown on a map entitled "Plan of Property in the Township of Egg Harbor, Ocean Heights Land and Improvement Company", lands of Anna A. Harned filed in the Atlantic County Clerk's Office on December 17, 1901 as Map #420.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Common Council of the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1. A PORTION OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY IS TO BE VACATED SUBJECT TO STATUTORY PRESERVATION OF EASEMENTS:**

All public easements, rights and interests to the portion of Atlantic Avenue described below, are hereby vacated, released and extinguished except for all rights and privileges now possessed by public utilities, as defined in N.J.S.A. 48:2-13, and by any cable television company, as defined in the "Cable Television Act," N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 et seq., to maintain, repair and replace their existing facilities in, adjacent to, over and under the street, or any part thereof, to be vacated subject to the conditions described herein, all conditions herein, unless otherwise noted, shall be satisfied prior to said vacation being effective.

**SECTION 2. DESCRIPTION OF THE PORTION OF ATLANTIC AVENUE TO BE VACATED:**

All that certain tract or parcel of land located in the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic, New Jersey bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING AT a found iron bar at the intersection of the Northwesterly line of Atlantic Avenue (50 feet wide unimproved) and the Northeasterly line of Ocean Avenue (66 feet wide); extending thence

1. North 33 degrees 25 minutes 09 seconds East along the Northwesterly line of Atlantic Avenue (50 feet wide unimproved), 241.80 feet to a point; thence
2. South 56 degrees 34 minutes 51 seconds East along a line parallel with Ocean Avenue (66 feet wide), 50.00 feet to a point; thence
3. South 33 degrees 25 minutes 09 seconds West along the Southeasterly line of Atlantic Avenue (50 feet wide unimproved), 241.80 feet to a point; thence
4. North 56 degrees 34 minutes 51 seconds West along the Northeasterly line of Ocean Avenue (66 feet wide), 50.00 feet to a point and place of BEGINNING

Being known as Atlantic Avenue as designated on Sheet 4 of the Official Tax Map of Somers Point, New Jersey.

CONTAINING a total area of 12,090.00 square feet (0.28 Acres).

**SECTION 3. STATUTORY PUBLICATION AND NOTICE:**

A. The City Clerk is directed to publish notice of the introduction of this Ordinance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-2; provided, however, that notice as to such introduction and the time and place when and where the Ordinance will be further considered for public hearing and final passage, shall be made, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-6, at least ten (10) days prior to the public hearing and adoption hereof.

B. At least seven (7) days prior to the time affixed for the consideration of this Ordinance for final passage, a copy thereof, together with a notice of the introduction thereof at a time and place when and where the Ordinance will be further considered for final passage, shall be mailed to every person whose land may be effected by this Ordinance insofar as has been ascertained by the City engineer. Said notices shall be made by the City Clerk to the record owners of:

C. Within sixty (60) days after adoption of this ordinance, the City Clerk is authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this ordinance to be filed with the office of the Atlantic County Register of Deeds and to the City Tax Assessor.

**SECTION 4. REPEALER CLAUSE.**

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with New Jersey law.

**WHEREAS**, while the Sen. Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq.) requires all meetings of the Somers Point City Council to be held in public, N.J.S.A.10:4-12(b) sets forth nine (9) types of matters that may lawfully be discussed in “Executive Session,” i.e. without the public being permitted to attend; and

**WHEREAS**, the Somers Point City Council has determined that Two (2) topics which require a discussion of: 1) a matter pending in litigation and Council on Affordable Housing issues responsive to the status of the litigation which requires advice of Counsel, and 2) the need to acquire certain real property for public use which requires the advice and counsel of the City Solicitor, City Engineer and other key personnel, and are both matters permitted by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) as exceptions to public meetings which are necessary to be discussed without the public in attendance during an Executive Session to be held on June 26, 2014 during a public meeting to be held commencing at 7:00 P.M; and

**WHEREAS**, of the nine (9) exceptions to public meetings set forth in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) the specific sections which apply to this matter is listed below, and next to the exception is a box within which the number of issues to be privately discussed that fall within each exception shall be written, and after each exception is a space where additional information that will disclose as much information about the discussion as possible without undermining the purpose of the exception shall be written.

**1** “(7) Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.”

**Advice and counsel to be received from the Special COAH Counsel to the City of Somers Point and / or the City Solicitor regarding the status of a Motion filed by Plaintiffs in New Jersey Superior Court Docket # ATL-L-007302-06 captioned “Bay Avenue Redevelopment, LLC vs. City of Somers Point, et als.” seeking relief from the Phasing Requirements of Section 3.1 of the May 7, 2007 Settlement Agreement and discussion of certain developments, including legal and practical implications which have arisen therefrom regarding the City’s continued compliance with its First and Second Round Affordable Housing Obligations and strategy for continued response to the Court and Special Master in compliance with the reporting directives imposed by the Court and Special Master; implications of Proposed Third Round Obligations.**

**1** “(5) Any matter involving the purchase lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of bank rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.”

The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

**The need to acquire a parcel of private property for public use utilizing municipal and /or Green Acres or other Grant Funding without necessity of exercising eminent domain; or the necessity to exercise the power of eminent domain if the City is otherwise unable to acquire the necessary property.**

**WHEREAS**, the length of the Executive Session is estimated to be approximately 20 - 30 minutes after which the public meeting of the City Council shall reconvene;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of Somers Point will go into Executive Session for only the above stated reason;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Council directs the City Clerk to make ten (10) photocopies of this resolution immediately after it passes and to distribute those photocopies to the public in attendance prior to the Executive Session commencing.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the blank spaces within this form of resolution are to be filled out in conformity with a Consent Judgment and Memorandum of Understanding dated June 8, 2009 that arose that the City Council hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) will be made public at a time when the public's interest in disclosure is greater than any privacy or governmental interest being protected from disclosure. **RESOLUTION No. 126 of 2014**

**A Resolution Authorizing the City Administrator of the City of Somers Point to Execute and Deliver a Superstorm Sandy Flood Claim Release Agreement on behalf of the City of Somers Point in favor of the Municipal Liability Joint Insurance Fund (MELJIF) and Zurich American Insurance Company**

**WHEREAS**, Zurich American Insurance Company (“Zurich”) issued commercial property policy number ERP 9806147 00 to the Municipal Liability Joint Insurance Fund (“MELJIF”) and “All member Entities ATIMA,” effective from December 31, 2011 to December 31, 2012 (the “Policy”); and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Somers Point (“Municipality”) is one of the Member Entities insured under the Policy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Policy covers various properties in other member municipalities located throughout the State of New Jersey (the “Properties”); and

**WHEREAS**, on or about October 29, 2012, the Properties sustained Wind and/or Flood damage as the result of Superstorm Sandy – CAT 90; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality sustained Flood damage to one or more of its properties as a result of Superstorm Sandy-CAT 90; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality submitted an insurance claim to Zurich under the Policy for Flood damage to one or more of The Municipality’s properties (the “Claim”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Policy contains a \$50 million per occurrence sublimit for losses and damage arising from Flood that may collectively be exceeded by all of the Member Entities’ covered Flood claims resulting from Superstorm Sandy and, as a result, Zurich cannot immediately issue full payment for the Municipality’s Flood claim but can only issue a prorated amount until such time as all Member Entities’ Flood claims are resolved and a pro rata determination is made determined in accordance with the Claims Resolution Procedure agreed to between Zurich and MELJIF; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality has agreed to accept the sum of \$474,746 in satisfaction of its Flood claim and within 20 days of the full execution of this Agreement, Zurich shall pay to The Municipality the sum of \$308,585 which amount constitutes 65% of the Municipality’s Flood claim; and

**WHEREAS**, the balance of The Municipality’s Flood claim in the amount of \$166,161 will be paid, in whole or in part, once all of the Member Entities’ Flood claims from Superstorm Sandy have been resolved and a pro rata distribution has been determined in accordance with the Claims Resolution Procedure agreed to between Zurich and MELJIF; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Administrator has evaluated the damages sustained by the Municipality and the settlement amount which has been proposed and which is deemed to be fair and reasonable;

Now, Therefore, it is hereby **RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, that the City Administrator is hereby duly authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver the form of Release and Settlement Agreement in the form attached hereto subject to such modifications as the City Administrator and City Solicitor deem to be reasonable or necessary; and

It is further **RESOLVED** that the City Administrator is authorized to execute any and all other documents necessary to effectuate this settlement.
