He stated that he has been working on bringing home the crew of the Intrepid and feels that this flag should not be flown until they have been brought home.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 250, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC

### **City of Somers Point**

Ordinance No. 3 of 2010

An Ordinance enacted under authority granted by N.J.S. 39:4-60
Permitting Charitable Organizations as defined by
N.J.S. 45:17A-20 to Solicit Contributions on certain Streets, Roadways
And Highways Subject to Required Application, Reviews, Authorizations,
And Approvals

**WHEREAS**, the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey haven enacted legislation as codified in <u>N.J.S.</u> 45:17A-20 prohibiting solicitation of charitable contributions from motorists on roadways in the State of New Jersey unless authorized by an Ordinance enacted by the municipality in which such roadways are situated; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Somers Point deems it to be in the public interest to permit charitable organizations as defined in <u>N.J.S.</u> 45:17A-20 to solicit contributions in roadways situate in the City of Somers Point, provided same is done in a safe and reasonable manner and in accordance with the procedures hereinafter set forth;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The City of Somers Point shall permit charitable organizations situate in the City of Somers Point and providing benefits to the citizens of Somers Point as defined in N.J.S. 45:17A-20 to solicit contributions generally referred to as "coin drops" in roadways situate in the City of Somers Point in accordance with the provisions contained herein.
- 2. All charitable organizations as defined in <u>N.J.S.</u> 45:17A-20 who desire to solicit such contributions in roadways situate in the City of Somers Point shall file an application for a permit with the Somers Point Municipal Clerk on a form supplied by said Clerk for that purpose, specifying the following information:
- A. Name of applicant organization.
- B. Address of applicant organization.
- C. Telephone number of applicant organization.
- <u>D.</u> Contact person for applicant organization.
- **E.** Specific location(s) of proposed charitable solicitation.
- <u>F.</u> Date(s) and time(s) of proposed charitable solicitation.
- <u>G.</u> If said request involves a county roadway and/or highway, said request shall include a copy of an authorization from the Atlantic County Board of Chosen Freeholders to permit said charitable solicitation.
- <u>H.</u> If said request involves a state roadway and/or highway, said request shall include a copy of an authorization from the State of New Jersey Commissioner of Transportation to permit said charitable solicitation.
- <u>I.</u> List of all proposed safety regulations, safety devices and training for individuals who shall participate in the charitable solicitation and/or a report as to the procedures to be used to ensure

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the safety of the members of the public who will be traversing the roadways and/or highways of the City of Somers Point.

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**Ordinance No. 3 (Continued)** 

- 3. No charitable organization shall be permitted to conduct more than one (1) such coin drop solicitation per year.
- 4. No approved coin drop solicitation shall be permitted for longer than a maximum of four (4) consecutive days.
- 5. No permits shall be granted by the City Clerk for more than a maximum of two (2) coin drop solicitations per calendar month.
- 6. All approved coin drop solicitations shall be conducted only during day light hours and shall commence no earlier than 9:00 am and be concluded no later than 8:00 pm.
- 7. No coin drop solicitation shall be conducted on any State road or highway situate within the City of Somers Point other than at the intersection of State Highway Route 9 and State Road Number 52; and shall be further subject to receipt of approval from the Director of the New Jersey Department of Transportation authorizing and approving the date, place and time for such coin drop.
- 8. All requests for authorization shall be reviewed by the Chief of Police or his designee of the City of Somers Point and said Chief shall make a recommendation to the City Council of the City of Somers Point as to the relative aspects of the request, including a review of the location, dates and times of the request, and a review of the safety procedures and/or methods to be employed by the said charitable organization. Said Chief of Police shall thereafter forward a report to the City Council of the City of Somers Point as to his/her opinion to the granting, rejecting or modification of any such proposed charitable solicitation.
- 9. Upon filing of a complete application and completion of the required review by the Chief of Police or his/her designee the application shall be presented to the City Council of the City of Somers Point for its review and consideration, after which the City Council shall grant or deny the applicant's request by Resolution. In the event the applicant's request is approved a permit shall issue to the applicant by the City Clerk which shall be subject to the representations contained in the applicant's application and any conditions imposed in the Resolution adopted by the Somers Point City Council.
- 10. In no event, shall any charitable organization requesting authorization from the City of Somers Point for said charitable solicitation use any individual under the age of 18 years to perform any function or task associated with the said charitable solicitation in any roadway.
- 11. Any charitable organization requesting authorization from the City of Somers Point for said charitable solicitation shall comply with all the terms and conditions of <u>N.J.S.</u> 39:4-60, as same may be amended and supplemented.
- 12. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to N.J.S. 39:4-60.
- 13. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance, other than that part held unconstitutional or invalid.
- 14. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication in the manner required by law.
