Public Portion:

- Linda Rile, Somers Point (*doug last name*)
 - Ms. Rile is a weekly user of the Senior Center and addressed the Commission.
 - Asked the restrooms be routinely cleaned.
 - The Pinochle Club generally has 20-25 people per week participate.
 - \circ $\;$ The middle room was at one time a room and now it has become a storage room.
 - o Suggested events for seniors such as
 - Bus trips
 - Back bay boat trips
 - Philadelphia Day soft pretzels; bands
 - In the past they had a Big Band Day and suggested a 60's or 70's day
 - Need to communicate with Seniors who do not have access to a computer or the internet and suggested advertising events in local newspapers.
 - Mrs. Murphy, Somers Point
 - Ms. Murphy is an OEM volunteer.
 - Mrs. Murphy was unaware of where the Senior Center is located and inquired about transportation to the center. Currently transportation to the center is not available. Mr. Murphy asked if it is something that could be available.
 - Joann Santoro, Somers Point
 - Ms. Santoro asked about available funding.
 - Commissioner Stewart explained that the current year's budget is completed and there are some limits now. When preparing the next budget, the Commission can request Council for additional funding.



- Molly Seltzer, Somers Point
 - Ms. Seltzer inquired about organizing Bridge Club.
 - Ms. Seltzer was informed that if there is an interest, the group can submit an application to reserve space to meet weekly.
 - \circ Suggested a trip to the Cape May County Zoo and to Cape May
- Susan Igoe, Somers Point
 - Ms. Igoe stated the playground at the Senior Center needing repairs.
 - Commission Stewart explained that we are aware of the needed updates to the playground at the Senior Center and Kennedy Park. Councilman McGuigan has been communicating with manufacturer. The playground equipment is being replaced site by site and Kennedy Park is a priority. Public Works inspects the equipment for safety. For liability purposes, the manufacturer repairs the equipment.
- Sue Weiler, Somers Point
 - Ms. Weiler's concern is the need for a good line of communication. Most seniors are not tech savy or do not have access to a computer or the internet. Suggestions were made to put notices at the supermarket, install a glass bulletin board at the Senior Center, place flyers at the little libraries and the Somers Point library.
