RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CLOSURE OF THE 9TH STREET BRIDGE FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXEPEDITING COMPLETION OF THE ROUTE 52 REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT FOR CERTAIN PERIODS TO BE DETERMINED BASED UPON A SERIES OF COLLABORATIVE MEETINGS HELD SUBSEQUENT TO DECEMBER 22, 2010 AND A PRESENTATION MADE TO THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT DURING AN OPEN PUBIC MEETING WITH DEMONSTRATION BY THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND ITS CONTRACTOR AS TO THE TIMING OF THE OPENING AND CLOSING, THE NECESSITY FOR SAME, AND THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS UPON WHICH THE CLOSURE WILL PROCEED Introduced By: Council President McGuigan, Councilman Smith & Councilman Dill

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) had made a unilateral decision to impose a complete and absolute closure of the 9th Street Bridge commencing on January 5, 2011; and

WHEREAS, during a meeting called by the NJDOT for that purpose on December 20,2010 neither the NJDOT nor its contractor had demonstrated why the absolute and total closure of the 9th Street Bridge is necessary as the only option instead of a partial closure which would allow for continued but limited use of the bridge; and

WHEREAS, during the course of that meeting a representative for the NJDOT Contractor ACT Engineering offered to engage in further dialogue with representatives of the governing bodies of the City of Somers Point and the City of Ocean City; and

WHEREAS, at a meeting of this governing body held on December 22, 2010 a Resolution was adopted opposing the unilateral decision to close the 9th Street Bridge for all of the reasons set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of that Resolution and the announcement by the Commissioner of Transportation that the 9th Street Bridge would not be unilaterally closed on January 5, 2011, meetings have been held by representatives of NJDOT and its contractor(s), including ACT Engineering, with designated members of both governing bodies (with less than a quorum in attendance) as well as members of the respective business communities and the general public; and

WHEREAS, as a result of such further dialogue the reasonableness and necessity of a bridge closing plan have been presented and the NJDOT has modified its earlier position; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has agreed to certain terms and conditions under which such closing of the 9th Street Bridge will occur including but not limited to:

- i) NJDOT will arrange for waiver of the Ocean City Longport Bridge toll during all periods of closure;
- ii) The dates and times of closing and of reopening as well as the number of lanes to be closed during each such period of time will be set forth in advance and committed to by the NJDOT and its contractor(s) and the NJDOT represents that the causeway will be closed to traffic on or about January 17th and is scheduled to reopen on or about April 15th with two lanes of traffic open in each direction on or about June 24th, 2011;
- iii) The reconstruction of the Shore Road Trolley Bridge will not be undertaken at the same time as the Bridge closing and the re-routing of traffic by detour will be further agreed to **Page 5**

among the City, the Atlantic County Engineer, the NJDOT and the NJDOT contractor(s) in order to minimize the adverse impacts;

- iv) The traffic configuration at what had been the Somers Point Circle and which has been disrupted during an effort to coordinate utility relocation will be promptly addressed; and lane markings, detour signs and other required traffic safety precautions will be implemented consistent with the requirements of the NJDOT Roadway Design Manual and Guidelines for Traffic Control including but not limited to appropriate signage on the Garden State Parkway, Shore Road, Laurel Drive, Mc Arthur Boulevard, the Mays Landing Somers Point Road and such other locations as may be necessary to inform the traveling public of the construction, the bridge closing, and the fact that local businesses are open during construction;
- v) The contractors engaged in the construction shall comply with the Somers Point Noise Ordinance including time of construction equipment operation, or will at some future time make a request to this governing body for a waiver of same upon a showing of good cause;
- vi) The NJDOT representatives and representatives of the contractor(s) will continue to meet regularly with City officials to keep them informed of the progress; and will likewise communicate with the public;
- vii). The NJDOT and its contractor(s) will work with local business owners affected by the closing to minimize to the extent practicable the adverse impact upon local business operations and will provide proper signage to inform potential customers that the local businesses are open and with proper markings to follow if there is traffic diversion;
- viii) During the period(s) of closure, the NJDOT and its contractor(s) agree to make subsequent appearances and reports during regularly scheduled meetings of this governing body upon reasonable timely request;
- The NJDOT and its contractor(s) will give timely written notice of any subsequent changes in the schedule of closing as hereinabove set forth due to acts of God or other elements of force majeure beyond the reasonable control of the NJDOT or its contractor(s) together with the reason for the adjustment and the extension of time, if any, as a result of the event;
- x) The support of this proposed closure under the terms and conditions set forth herein is further subject to the adoption of a resolution by the governing body of the City of Ocean City supporting the closure; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the ongoing dialogue and clearer understanding of the planned construction timetable, subject to the conditions above set forth and relying in good faith upon the representations of NJDOT and its contractor representatives

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Somers Point that the closure of the 9th Street Bridge upon the proposed schedule and subject to compliance by NJDOT and its contractors with each of the conditions above set forth is hereby supported as being reasonable and necessary and in the best interest of allowing a timely completion of the project for the benefit of the City of Somers Point, the City of Ocean City, the entire region and our vital tourist trade; and

WHEREAS, following those presentations and after careful deliberation, the Somers Point Planning Board adopted a resolution recommending that the consulting firm of Brown & Keener, a Division of The RBA Group with offices at 1315 Walnut Street, Suite 900, Philadelphia, PA be authorized to provide the scope of services to be completed by September 30, 2011 for a not to exceed services price of Forty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$47,790.00) as more fully set forth within the RFP; and

WHEREAS, Brown and Keener has successfully developed multiple major projects inclusive of: the Upper Schuylkill Open Space Master Plan for the design and implementation of a system of prioritized initiatives to improve public access along the river; a Strategic Plan for the Northeast Region for Gloucester County, NJ to create commercial centers and neighborhoods; the Revitalization of York, PA through the utilization of a city wide summit mechanism; and Asbury Park, NJ Main Street Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, Brown and Keener has developed an expertise in envisioning futures, raising civic expectations, developing agendas to build consensus and create change while applying smart growth principles; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funds for the payment of the services intended to be rendered have been included within the Somers Point Municipal Budget and have been certified as being available to pay for the project; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 permits the governing body of a municipality to fix the rate of interest to be charged for the nonpayment of taxes or assessments and sewer charges;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, that:

- 1. In the event that payments of taxes or assessments and sewer charges are not paid on the due date, but are paid within a period of ten (10) days in the case of taxes, or thirty (30) days in the case of assessments and sewer charges, the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to charge no interest on all such delinquent payments.
- 2. In the event that payments of taxes or assessments and sewer charges are not paid within ten (10) days in the case of taxes, or thirty (30) days in the case of assessments and sewer charges, the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to charge interest at the rate of eight percent per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18 percent per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 to be calculated from the date the tax or assessment was payable until the date of actual payment.
- 3. N.J.S.A. 54:6-67 specifically provides that a governing body may fix a penalty to be charged to a taxpayer where there is a tax and/or other municipal charge delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 at the end of any calendar year on a given parcel of real estate; and
- 4. That a penalty equal to six percent of the amount of any delinquency in taxes and other municipal charges on a given parcel of real property shall be and is hereby imposed where the delinquency exceeds \$10,000.00 at the end of each calendar year.
